


Visiting Author Jacqueline Harvey Monday 24th October



Kennedy School Games Programme

Additionally, for children in Year 4 to 6, please ensure your child has the correct kit for their Unit:

Rugby - although there is no mandate from the HKRFU we strongly recommend the use of mouthguards when playing rugby.

By popular demand the school is delighted to announce that the Breakfast Fitness Clubs will be running again after the half term break. During these sessions children will work on their general fitness and running technique.


There will be two clubs, both will be run by a coach from ESF Ed Services and are open to children from Y4-6. One will run on a Tuesday from 7:30 to 8:15am on the North Wing Roof and the other will run on a Thursday from 7:30 - 8:15am in the same location.

The cost of each club will be \$600 for six sessions. The clubs will start on Tuesday 1st and Thursday 3rd November and run until Tuesday 6th and Thursday 8th December. Registration will be via the **Gateway and will open on Monday 24th October at noon**. Once you have registered successfully, your account will be debited so please ensure you have a sufficient balance.
