Our assemblies this week have had a focus on being good friends, being kind to one another and looking out for each other. Below are a few tips for you if your child ever needs to talk to you about a family member or a friends death.

1. Be honest and open; it's ok to use the words dead or
death.
2. Answer facts in short simple sentences without unnecessary detail.
3. Be available to listen and assist with any concerns.
4. Respect their views with non-judgemental responses.
5. Take time to talk about a person's life, not only their death.
6. Give comfort, hugs and reassurance as needed by your child.
7. Children deal with grief/ death differently to adults and they will make sense of information in their way and often revisit for more discussion and clarification.

## YEAR 2 - OLD FASHIONED DAY



The Year 2 children and teachers had a lot of fun role playing a day in the life of a school child 100 years ago: Everyone dressed up and ensured that their uniforms were immaculate. Shiny shoes, neck ties and hair ribbons were very apparent. Some children even brought their lunch to school in a brown paper bag. The day started with a very formal assembly in the hall where the children played along famously and responded well when they were addressed by a very serious principal and very strict teachers. It was extremely difficult not to laugh but everyone stayed in
character, both teachers and students. The specialist teachers came to the classrooms where Chinese and Music were taught traditionally through lots of repetitive chanting and rote learning as the children politely sat in rows. Blackboards and chalk were used to copy spellings and sums and the children wrote using paint brushes and ink pots. The day ended with all the children attending Physical Education in the playground to partake in robust old fashioned drills. The children really learnt to appreciate how splendid school was for children way back in the good 'ol days.



Kennedy entered three teams into the DBIS Touch Rugby Tournament on Friday, two boys teams and a girls team. All three teams won their respective qualifying groups. The Boys A team were knocked out of their competition in a very closely fought game against Kellett Pokfulam. The match decided on a sudden death try during the drop off, when each team is reduced by a player during each minute of extra time. They developed as a team as they progressed through the day and deservedly beat QBS in their final to become the first Kennedy girls team to win a competition during the last decade.
